Eligible claimants must file **Form DP-6** Application for Education Property Tax Relief, between May 15, 2002 and June 30, 2002. All claims shall be accompanied by the 2000 Federal Tax Return and final 2001 property tax bill. If a claim has already been filed, the Department will recalculate the amount of relief and send a check if the increase is \$5.00 or more.
