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- If on the day of the hearing the Taxpayer cannot attend, the Taxpayer is urged to call the Hearings Bureau at (603) 230-5002.
- A representative of the Hearings Bureau will connect the Taxpayer with a representative of the Division to see if the Division objects, assents, or takes no position on the Taxpayer's request to continue the hearing.
- Any request for a continuance of hearing must comply with N.H. Code of Admin. Rules, Rev, 203.02.
- The request to continue hearing must state the following:
 - The purpose and relief sought by the request
 - State specific reasons for the request
 - That concurrence of the request has been sought as follows:
 - The opposing party objects, assents, or takes no position
 - You attempted to reach the opposing party with no success.

How to Request a Last-Minute Continuance

- As it is the day of the hearing, the Taxpayer may fax at (603) 230-5948 or email at DRAHearings@DRA.NH.GOV a courtesy copy of its request. The Taxpayer is still required to file the request for continuance by mail or dropped off at the front lobby at a later date.
- If the Hearing Officer determines that it is appropriate to continue the scheduled hearing, a representative of the Hearings Bureau will contact the Taxpayer to confirm that the hearing has been continued to another date.
- The parties will be informed by a written order of the Hearings Officer's decision and if the request was granted, the written order will indicate a new date and time of the hearing.
